Program note

German Jewish poet and Nobel laureate Nelly Sachs created a unique body of work commemorating the Holocaust. She and her mother managed to flee Germany on the last flight allowed out of Germany to Sweden and lived there for the rest of her life. In “Nacht der Nächte,” Sachs manages in a few lines to express an enormous depth of loss and desolation with the hope of eventual redemption. I have made my own translation of the poem and included some German from the poem because of the unique vividness of the poet’s language. The musical language of the piece is veers towards and away tonality and exploits many pianistic colors.


Night of Nights – German poem by Nelly Sachs, English interpretation by Anna Rubin

Night fell - a coffin full of black fire,
Ein Sarg aus schwarzem Feuer-
The red colors of amen, *die roten Amenfarben*,
Enfolded themselves within, within the black fire.
in this purple were rooted Teeth, hair and the flesh – a body –, *in dieser purpur*.
A tree trembled in the wind of a ghost – *im Geisterwind* -
Bright as light - *Hellgesichtig* - this fierce angel with one day on earth,
its face brilliant and burning –
burst into fire, black fire.
The flames – *Die Flammen*-- fled into the very soul of the living .
Musik – Music rang through into the shape of resurrection.
